

Step 4 Grievance Filed on Delayed Retro Payments

On February 21, 2020, the Postal Service notified the NRLCA that the contractual retro payment would be delayed once again due to programming issues within the system. This delay would cause the retro payment to be processed and paid on May 15, 2020.

The National Agreement was ratified on August 6, 2019. This latest delay would cause rural carriers to wait some forty weeks before receiving the retro payment.

This delay is inexcusable, excessive, unreasonable, and unprecedented. Rural carriers have been harmed by being deprived of these required retro payments.

The Postal Service has unjustly enjoyed an interest windfall as rural carriers have waited patiently and had to forgo or delay financial decisions, losing out on the opportunity to accrue interest and realize other gains through their TSP contributions and other investments.

The Postal Service has not kept its contractual promise and we intend to enforce the

National Agreement at Step 4 or in National Arbitration.

A lot of questions are asked, very few answers are known. One thing that is for certain is that every local county unit will have a meeting this year prior to your state convention. Someone will be elected to be your county president, vice president, and secretary treasurer. Each and every local will elect delegates to your state convention.

I hear this question every year, "Who wants to go to the state convention?". I also hear "I would go if I could get my leave approved". We do have in our

contract, in Article 24, the language that guarantees you this right. So if you are elected as a delegate, turn your leave slip in the next day you are at the post office. If your leave is denied or "I don't know "or "I will see", file a grievance and contact your steward immediately to see that this leave request will happen. Your duty is to request leave timely. Remember, this does apply to RCA's who are delegates also.

Your state board will have someone at your local meeting that will give you information on topics ranging from upcoming events to political events. Your board representative will do their best to answer your questions.

Remember it is each counties responsibility to request a NSS steward to be present at your meeting. So do so in advance, in writing,



to your appropriate District Representative (DR). Your state officers cannot answer steward questions.

The Time is Now / Now is the Time

No matter how you say it, what better time will there be? If not now, then when? I'm sure you've heard; this is an election year. I know many of you who are reading this already do vote and many of you vote in every election, so for you, I want to say thank you. If that is the case skip the next couple paragraphs.

I've heard it more than once: "my vote doesn't count" and you would be right... if you fail to exercise that right. The right that has been defended by many over the past 200 plus years. I realize that life is just plain busy and this is just

something else I have to do and you're right again but here's my point; it is actually easier than ever to cast your vote.

USPS Fairness Act H.R.2382-This bill didn't pass just because it was a good idea that made sense: it was the result of intensive lobbying ... and yes that includes the NRLCA.

In this day and age, the easiest way to do this is to go online to myvote.wi.gov, enter your name and birth date and it will tell you if you are registered. Enter your address and it will tell you where your polling place is and the date of the next election. If you aren't going to be able to make it to the polling place on that date there is a link to request an absentee ballot. Also available is the schedule for other ways to vote early at your Municipal Clerk's office. Every municipality is different so you need to check it out. There you go, that wasn't so hard after all.

The next thing to do is become familiar with the issues. Each of us has local issues like; the road on the way to work that really needs to be repaired or the snow removal that isn't being done in a timely fashion. In this case, you call your county supervisor or alderman. One thing we as

federal employees or retired federal employees (whose retirement is administered by the Office of Personnel Management-OPM) all have in common, is it is affected greatly by what happens in congress.

Within the last few weeks, we have seen the Federal USPS Fairness Act H.R.2382 pass in the house of Representatives and now has been sent to the Senate. Just a reminder, this bill repeals the requirement that the U.S. Postal Service annually prepay future retiree health benefits. This requirement has accounted for between 75% and 80% of the losses that the Postal Service has reported for the past 10 years.

The process continues. This bill didn't pass just because it was a good idea that made sense: it was the result of intensive lobbying by all of the Postal unions and yes that includes the NRLCA. The contribution of all of you who took the time to contact their representative was also a major

factor in its passage. But as I indicated, the process continues in the Senate where we need to continue to educate our senators. Senator Baldwin has expressed her support of this bill. Senator John-

son has not commented since it passed the house. This is where, once again, we as constituents can play a roll in pushing this legislation forward. I am going to continue to ask that you contact our senators and let them know that this would go a long way to securing the financial future of the USPS.

While we have the attention of our congressional representatives, we need to continue to educate them on the other piece of legislation that affects rural carriers that delivered mail as an RCA. H.R. 2478; sometimes referred to as the "Buy Back" bill. This bill allows non-deduction service performed on or after January 1, 1989, to be creditable under FERS so long as a deposit is made into the retirement fund.

The language in italics is directly from the bill. What it means is; a person who carried mail as an RCA (starting after Jan. 1, 1989) and now has become a regular would have the option of depositing an amount into their retirement from those years as an RCA. The longer you worked as an RCA the more that amount would be. It would be up to the individual if they want to buy back that time.

I could go on about additional legislation but as I mentioned it's an election year and the possibility of comprehensive postal reform is little to none. So, the focus is being placed on legislation that has broad bipartisan support. Please use all the tools provided to us to have our voices heard.

As I close, I need to remind you we are approach-

ing spring meeting season, several have already been held but many are yet to come. Now would be a good time to plan on attending the Spring Conference, your local meeting, Mid-States Conference, the State or National Convention. All of these gatherings are held for the benefit of you, to provide you with information on issues that affect your job and your eventual retirement from the job. Also, another place to have your voice heard. Please check the schedule of upcoming events and make those plans today.



Signing up for Withholding Active carriers may elect to use one of their three payroll allotments to donate every two weeks. You must sign up for withholding exclusively through PostalEase. Have readily available your 8digit Employee ID Number (on your paycheck stub) and your 4-digit USPS PIN or password. If you don't have your USPS PIN you will need to call PostalEase at: 877-477-3273. Press #1 for PostalEase. When prompted, enter your employee identification number. When prompted for your pin, pause, and then press #2. Your PIN will be mailed to your address on the next business day. Steps for signing up Online: 1. Add your Employee I.D. number to the end of the 9-digit NRLCA-PAC Account (163055555) to create your PostalEase account number. 2. Now you are ready to log into: liteblue.usps.gov. 3. Enter your employee I.D. number and password, then click "log on." 4. Click on "PostalEase." 5. Click on "I Agree." 6. Enter your Employee I.D. and password again and log in. 7. You will find the nominating ballot on pages 24-25 of The National Rural Letter Carrier magazine. All the instructions are on the tan colored pages- nominate a fellow carrier or yourself and be sure to send each nomination ballot in its own envelope to Wisconsin RLCA, National Delegate Nomination, PO Box 402, Tomah, WI 54660-0402 by May 7. I strongly encourage every member to attend at least one national convention at some point in their career, whether you attend as a delegate or not- it is a lifechanging experience like none other you will participate in. I could sit here and write on and on about all the things that happen at the National Convention, but it wouldn't do justice to how

it changes you. It is like the ugly green and black caterpillars seen in the Spring that morphs into the ever popular Monarch butterfly.

As a caterpillar, you are stuck on the milk-weed, being constrained to only the one spot in the road ditch or field feeding upon what is in front of you. Like a carrier stuck in an office and only aware of what goes on in the town around you.



You have no idea there is more out there.... there are ditches with wild flowers and fields with others like you...until you grow wings and venture out of your cocoon. You suddenly have control of where you want to go and you can get there so much quicker (now, that you have wings)—like you have a purpose.

RRECS Mapping- article by Kirby Ricketts, DR for Gateway District

When we start creeping closer to spring, it reminds us of the changes to come. More daylight, warmer days, roads on many of your routes changing from ice/snow to dust/mud, switching from hunting to fishing and going from watching football to baseball. As a Rural Carrier, there is one other change heading your way, RRECS Mapping. The pilot program has been rolled out in 8 districts across the nation, Northern Virginia, Ohio Valley, Northern New England, Sacramento, Pio Grande, Suncoast, Arizona and Gateway. By the time you read this article, all these districts should have their pilot offices completed, and be in the process of sending facilitators out to other offices in their districts. Here in Gateway, we believe we will have our pilot office done by February 21st. Even if you are not in one of the abovementioned districts, the RRECS will be headed your way shortly. I won't go into great details about the program, but will give you the basics on what to expect.

The first thing you have to know is **that participation is not optional**, if you are the regular carrier on a rural route, you will take part in mapping your route at some point and time. If the route is vacant, or held down by an RCA/PTF, they will do the mapping.

Since I know this will be one of the first and biggest questions asked, I'll go ahead and answer it now, **Q: Do I get additional pay for sitting down and mapping my route?** A: No, auxiliary assistance will be provided to you the day you map your route.

How long will it take you to map your route? This is the million-dollar question! If you've scanned packages at the door like you were supposed to, ran your route like you were supposed to, have kept your edit book up to date, and were fortunate enough to have a management member that kept up your 4003....then the mapping should go very smoothly. Mapping is basically marking 4 things for each deliver you have on your route, box location, the stop (usually the same as the box location), package/accountable delivery (usually the front door of the customer), and parking location (where you park when delivering a package/accountable to a customer). If you've been scanning correctly, many of these 4 points will already show in the proper location, you'll only have to verify they are correct. For example, if you've been scanning you parcels at your vehicle, then taking them to the door, or scanning at the box, and heaven forbid hanging the parcel, then the customers front door location might show a location of the middle of the street or at the box. Since parcels are to be scanned at the delivery point, this system downloads the information that you fed it when scanning. For those of you that did all of your scanning correctly, you may see that many of vour deliver points have 3 of the 4 icons (Continued from page 29)



Route Adjustments:

There are two types of adjustments currently occurring in the Northland District. The first type is the normal adjustment created for operational reasons usually being overburdened; is pretty straight forward if carriers are properly notified and utilize the information in this article. The second is much more subtle and ties to the 'scanner'. Briefly what occurs is the scanner 'inaccurately' measures the miles traveled daily by carriers; management looks at this and sees a wide discrepancy and then 'creatively' in many instances goes on line and google maps the route rather than actually measuring it thus submitting changes to operations which are processed as base hour changes in mileage affecting the EMA and at times cutting the paid evaluations. Carriers do need challenge this immediately in the grievance process if this occurs.

Failure of any rural carrier to exercise his/her contractual right to submit written comments would greatly diminish the likelihood of prevailing in the grievance process. Management's failure to involve the carrier (s) in the adjustment procedure is a violation of the National Agreement, Article 30.1.J, and is a grievable issue. The likelihood of prevailing in a route adjustment grievance would depend largely on how closely the established route adjustment guidelines were followed.

A carrier who is considering filing a grievance concerning a route adjustment should be prepared to furnish documentation. The following items are essential for any route adjustment grievance:

- involved
- Written comments submitted by the carriporting its position. er

- PS Form 4241-A for the time period immediately prior to the adjustment (If growth is a factor, include PS Form(s) 4241-A for the previous 12 months)
- PS Form 4241-A for the time period immediately after the adjustment
- Color-coded maps indicating the location of route(s) being adjusted as well as the adjacent and/or surrounding routes
- PS forms 4240 (Trip Sheets) for the 12 months prior to the adjustment in order to establish whether or not the carrier consistently met dispatch and/or stayed under 2,080 work-hours for the guarantee year
- Transportation schedule to show dispatch times
- Pertinent pages from the Rural Route Adjustment Guidelines & Procedures
- Section 823.1 of the M-38

If a carrier feels the potential for a grievance exists, he/she should discuss the issues with management as well as involve the local steward in those discussions and do so in a timely manner

<u>Important note:</u>

An Arbitration Award out of Beatrice, NE related to management adjusting a route below 43K (M-38.823.1) without management providing a reasonable explanation of the operational issues to adjust below a 43K was further supported by a second arbitration award on July 27, 2018 from Buzzards Bay, MA that refers back to the Beatrice, NE award. Both awards also required management to adjust the routes back to a 43K and provided a make-whole remedy. Management must aim to leave a regular route at 52 standard hours if it is the subject of a route adjustment. If management does not do so, it must provide a good Route adjustment worksheets for all routes reason why adjusting the route to 52 standard hours was not practical, as well as evidence sup(Continued from page 32)

There is nothing that prevents management from adjusting above 52 hours if necessary.

If every carrier were to review Article 30, read the PO 603, report to work ready, willing, and able to perform all tasks for which they are employed asking management for information and discussing issue/s knowing that the need to file a grievance if they do not receive a favorable or appropriate response is the proper procedure followed by the completion with management of the 8191 through #4. The 8191 then immediately presented to their local (assigned) steward along with their statement, form 50 and other appropriate documentation. The end result by default likely would be a better work place.

Carriers always need be vigilant in the performance of their jobs to include reviewing the Contract, the PO 603, our National Magazine, State Newsletters, and utilize the official NRLCA website. All members need follow the actions or inactions in Congress on matters related to the Postal Service. Congressional actions significantly affect our craft and those we serve as rural carriers!
